Just a few friendly reminders to everyone. All dog waste must be picked up (*even if it is in your own yard*) and properly disposed of either in your own garbage or in one of the three new dog waste containers that have been installed along Kings Isle Blvd (*complete with disposal bags*) for your use.

In addition, all dogs must be on a leash at all times when outside your home. This also applies to your visitors who may have a dog. They must be on leash and the visitor (*or owner*) must pick up any dog waste. The owner is responsible for conveying this rule to their visitors.

Please remember that our speed limit in the Isle of Capri is only 14 mph. Please obey this speed limit and our stop signs. Any home health aides and visitors must also obey our stop signs and speed limits. There are many residents walking or riding bikes on our streets so please drive carefully, safely and obey the traffic rules.

As spring approaches, please take a look around your home for any issues that may need attention such as mold or mildew on either the roof, soffit, fascia, gutters, lanai or the house itself. Also, check your mailbox for mildew, as it must also be free of mold or mildew and in good repair.

Below is a list of *Frequently Asked Questions* that may be helpful to you as a new /seasoned resident. Please do not hesitate to call any member of the Board if you have questions regarding living in Kings Isle.

Let's all continue to work together to insure Capri remains a safe, clean and beautiful neighborhood.

Reference: Rules & Regulations Document. dated. October 29, 2019

Q: Can I place ornaments in my yard?

A: Up to three (3) ornaments (*statues, urns, pots etc*) each of a size not to exceed 24 in. high by 24 in. wide may only be placed in the front bordered garden area.

[Section 9 (B), Page 4]

Q: Can I leave my garage door open for better circulation through the house?

A: No. The garage door may only be open when requiring access to the garage. However, you may install an additional white screen door that allows for air circulation *(ARC approval required)*

[Section 10 (**C**) Page 5]

Q: Can I park my car in the driveway and use the garage for storage?

A: Owners/Residents' automobiles shall be parked in the garage or driveway. Motorcycles and golf carts must be parked in the garage.

[Section 10 (B), Page 4]

Q. When is the regular trash pick-up days /times?

A: Trash is collected by FCC every Wednesday. Trash should be placed in the black bin provided by the City. Recycles are also picked up on Wednesday (green containers). These containers should be placed at curbside (more than 3 feet apart from each other or any obstruction), no earlier than 5:00 pm on Tuesday evening, or by 7:00 am on Wednesday morning. Yard waste placed at curbside will also be picked up on Wednesday. Bulk waste is picked up once a month every second Wednesday of the month.

Q. Can I remove existing shrubbery in my front yard and replace it with other landscaping?

A: Yes, ARC approval required.

[Section 16 (B), Page 7]

Q: What size must our animals be?

A. Two domestic animals less than 25 lbs each, or one weighing no more than 40 lbs.

Q. Can I install a hot tub on my lanai?

A. Yes, but a city permit is required.

Q: Can I have metal roof installed.

A: Yes. we are now allowed to have metal roofs. Each Isle will have specific guidelines to follow.

Q: Who can I call if the street light by my house is on during the day?

A: You may call *Florida Power & Light* directly at (772) 462-0555, providing them with the pole number.

Q. I have a water leak in my front yard what do I need to do?

A: Call St. Lucie West Services District at 772-340-0220 to report any water or sewage issues.
