## Why Item Should Never Be Placed in the Blue Recycling Cart

Plastic bags, hoses, cords and plastic films get wrapped around the gears at the sorting facility.



Dense or heavy metals can damage the machinery at the sorting facility.

Items smaller than 2" in size do not sort properly and often fall into the wrong container.

Place shredded paper and loose bottle caps in the garbage.



(Some local stores will recycle shredded paper for a fee.)

Residents may bring heavy metals and more to be recycled

at the Landfill or one of the 5

Customer Convenience Centers.

Great news! The sorting facility for Indian River County has just announced that bottle caps may be recycled if they are securely fastened to the bottle.

Indian River County is striving to reach Florida's statewide goal of recycling 75% of our waste by the year 2020. The numbers for 2017 have arrived...

The recycling rate for **Indian River County** has increased to 64%!
