## FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS SHEET

## The Residences II at World Golf Village Condominium Association, Inc.

As of June 1, 2022

- Q: What are my voting rights in the condominium association?
- A: Each unit is entitled to one vote.
- Q: What restrictions exist in the condominium documents on my right to use my unit?
- A: The unit may be used as a single family dwelling only.
- Q: What restrictions exist in the condominium documents on the leasing of my unit?
- A: No unit owner may lease any unit for a period of less than 7 days, nor may they lease any unit without prior approval of the association.
- Q: How much are my assessments to the condominium association for my unit type and when are they due?
- A: The 2022 monthly assessment for all units is \$594.00 and is due the 1st of each month.
- Q: Do I have to be a member in any other association: If so, what is the name of the association and what are my voting rights in this association? Also, how much are my assessments?
- A: You are required to be members of three associations and each owner has one vote per association:
  - 1. The St. Johns Northwest Master Association, Inc.; the 2015 assessment is \$7.83 per month per unit and is contained within the condominium assessment.
  - 2. The St. Johns Northwest Residential Association, Inc.; the 2022 assessment is \$63.33 per month per unit and is contained within the condominium assessment.
  - 3. The Amenities Association for the Residences Inc.: the 2022 assessment is \$160.00 per month per unit and is paid directly to the association by each owner.
- Q: Am I required to pay rent or land use fees for recreational or other commonly used facilities? If so, how much am I obligated to pay annually?

Q: Is the condominium association or other mandatory membership association involved in any court cases in which it may face liability in excess of \$100,000? If so, identify each case.
